

Utilities

- AT&T- Damages caused by the wildfire in Lake County have interrupted wireless and landline services in the Lake County area. To address these issues, AT&T teams have deployed a Satellite Cell on Wheels (COWs) and two Cell on Light Trucks (COLTs) supporting wireless communication in the area. Additionally, AT&T is:
 - Supplying cell phones and charging stations to the evacuation center at the Napa County Fairgrounds, 1435 N. Oak St. in Calistoga.
 - Offering free 10G data to customers in the 95453, 95451, 95457 and 95461 zip codes
 - Waving wireline installation and wiring changes through October 15 for customers displaced due to the fire
 - Waiving the activation fee and providing one month of free Remote Call Forwarding service for customers affected by the fire.
 - Customers can contact: 1-800-288-2020 to arrange for the waiver of fees.
