Betty T. Yee Releases Yolo County Assessment Practices Survey Report

Betty T. Yee, Chairwoman of the Board of Equalization, today released the Yolo County Assessment Practices Survey Report. The Report focuses on the quality of the 2008-09 Yolo County assessment roll, consisting of 64,793 assessments representing approximately \$20.5 billion in value.

The Yolo County Assessment Practices Survey Report states that most properties in Yolo County are assessed properly, and that the overall quality of the assessment roll meets state standards. The Report notes nine recommendations for improvement to the Yolo County Assessor's programs, and includes the Yolo County Assessor's response to the BOE's recommendations. The BOE is the agency responsible for promoting statewide uniformity and consistency in property tax assessment, reviewing each county's property assessment practices and procedures once every five years and publishing an assessment practices survey report. The report provides an overview of how well the assessor's duties are performed and identifies where improvements should be made. Every assessor is required to identify and assess all properties located within the county – unless specifically exempt – and maintain a database or "roll" of the properties and their assessed values. If the assessor's roll meets state requirements, the county is allowed to recapture some administrative costs.
