- Relief from Penalty
- Relief from Interest
- Relief from Penalty and Interest Due to a Disaster
- Relief from Collection Cost Recovery Fee
- Declaration of Timely Mailing
- Extension of Time in Which to File a Tax/Fee Return

“The BOE is committed to using technological innovation to help our customers get the assistance they need quickly,” said Ms. Yee.

Submitting eRelief Requests is convenient, fast, and secure. The request will be acknowledged immediately and taxpayers can instantly find out if their request is granted, denied, or needs further review – saving them time and money.



To get started, taxpayers will need their eClient ID and password or they can use their account number and Express Login code.

The BOE is expanding its online resources to better assist taxpayers, and help businesses succeed by offering helpful and easy-to-use [eServices](#) (electronic services). This eService expansion follows the launch of BOE's electronic registration service ([eReg](#)) and compliments other BOE eServices, such as [eFile](#) (filing tax returns online) and [ePay](#) (paying electronically).
