Free Income Tax Return Preparation at VITA Events in Fresno County

Sacramento – Individuals and families who need help with income tax return preparation are invited to attend a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) event at the Fresno Fair Grounds. The event is sponsored by the United Way of Fresno County and Board of Equalization Member George Runner.

“This program provides free tax preparation to individuals and families who may not be able to afford a tax preparer. Connecting qualified earners with the Earned Income Tax Credit provides them with valuable support during difficult economic times and boosts our state and local economy,” said Runner.

The federal government is offering up to \$5,891 in Earned Income Tax Credits (EITC) to households earning less than \$50,270 annually. Free VITA events throughout California help qualified taxpayers receive much needed federal and state tax credits. Every year, VITA volunteers who have been trained and certified by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), offer free tax filing assistance.

Qualifying individuals and families can obtain free tax preparation assistance at select schools, community centers, and nonprofit organizations throughout California.
