NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS  
OF THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

Notice is hereby given that the State Board of Equalization, pursuant to the authority vested in Section 15606 of the Government Code and Sections 434 and 434.5 of the Revenue and Taxation Code and to implement, interpret and make specific Article 1.7, Chapter 3, Part 2, Division 1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code proposes to reconsider certain site values set forth in regulations in Subchapter 11, Chapter 1, Title 18 of the California Administrative Code, as follows:

(1) Reconsider site values in Regulation 1025 which presently reads:

1025. Value of Timberland

On March 1, 1980, and March 1 of each year thereafter, up to and including March 1, 1982, timberland shall be valued per acre according to the following schedule:

Redwood Region		Pine-Mixed Conifer Region	
Site I.....	\$100	Site I.....	\$70
Site II.....	\$80	Site II.....	\$56
Site III.....	\$60	Site III.....	\$43
Site IV.....	\$45	Site IV .....	\$25
Site V (and inoperable).....	\$30	Site V (and inoperable).....	\$20


When the assessor, pursuant to Section 434 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, designates a timberland parcel or portion thereof as inoperable, such timberland parcel, or portion thereof, shall be valued as if it is Site V.

Notice is also given that any person interested may present statements or arguments orally or in writing relevant to the action proposed, at Room 102, 1020 N Street, Consumer Affairs Building, Sacramento, CA 95814, at 2:00 p.m., on May 6, 1980. The State Board of Equalization, upon its own motion or at the instance of any interested person may thereafter reaffirm the existing site values as above set forth or modify said values without further notice.

Note: The State Board of Equalization has determined these regulations involve no cost or savings to, local, state, or federal governments under Section 11421 of the Government Code.
