Property tax on the personal residence of the elderly should end at age 65, as most retirees have little savings, and no pension other than a tiny social security stipend, and huge medical expenses, which leaves little for paying property taxes on a home in California.

It should be unconscionable to force the elderly out of the homes they worked entire lives to pay for, only to discover the tax payments never end, long after their jobs had ended.
