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George Runner Releases Tehama County Assessment Practices Survey Report

George Runner, Second District Member of the California State Board of Equalization (BOE), today released the Tehama County Assessment Practices Survey Report on the quality of the 2009-10 Tehama County assessment roll, representing approximately \$4.7 billion in value.

The Tehama County Assessment Practices Survey Report states that most properties in Tehama County are assessed properly, and that the overall quality of the assessment roll meets state standards. The survey report notes 12 recommendations for improvement to the Tehama County Assessor's programs, and includes the Assessor's responses to the BOE's recommendations. The BOE is the agency responsible for promoting statewide uniformity and consistency in property tax assessment, reviewing each county's property assessment practices and procedures once every five years and publishing an assessment practices survey report. The report provides an overview of how well the assessor's duties are performed and identifies where improvements should be made. Every assessor is required to identify and assess all properties located within the county – unless specifically exempt – and maintain a database or "roll" of the properties and their assessed values. If the assessor's roll meets state requirements, the county is allowed to recapture some administrative costs.
