## **George Runner Releases El Dorado County Assessment Practices Survey Report**

George Runner, Second District Member of the State Board of Equalization (BOE), today released the El Dorado County Assessment Practices Survey Report on the quality of the 2009-10 El Dorado County assessment roll, representing approximately \$27.4 billion in value.

The El Dorado County Assessment Practices Survey Report states that most properties in El Dorado County are assessed properly, and that the overall quality of the assessment roll meets state standards. The survey report notes twelve recommendations for improvement to the El Dorado County Assessor's programs and includes the El Dorado County Assessor's response to the BOE's recommendations. The BOE is the agency responsible for promoting statewide uniformity and consistency in property tax assessment, reviewing each county's property assessment practices and procedures once every five years and publishing an assessment practices survey report. The report provides an overview of how well the assessor's duties are performed and identifies where improvements should be made. Every assessor is required to identify and assess all properties located within the county – unless specifically exempt – and maintain a database or "roll" of the properties and their assessed values. If the assessor's roll meets state requirements, the county is allowed to recapture some administrative costs.
