**CHIANG ANNOUNCES MAJOR REVISION TO
BOARD RULES OF PRACTICE**

Input Sought on California Tax Administration and Appellate Review

John Chiang, Chairman of the California State Board of Equalization, today announced the Board would seek public input on a major revision to its rules of practice beginning with a September 28 Board meeting. The Board of Equalization Rules for California Tax Administration and Appellate Review -- launched by the Board this Summer -- will replace the Board's current rules of practice with more comprehensive guidelines to guarantee a fair hearing with due process for all taxpayers.

"We're strongly calling for public input in this process, because it will allow us to create guidelines that address any public concerns and maintain the flexibility and ease of understanding of our rules to the benefit of California taxpayers," said Chairman Chiang.

The Taxpayers Bill of Rights provides that "taxes are the most sensitive point of contact between citizens and their government." The Board recognizes this sensitivity and invites interested persons to help bolster the public nature and openness of the Board's operations.

Promoting taxpayer accessibility to Board Members and allowing the free flow of information will also allow the quasi-judicial body to continue to hold effective public hearings and render fair decisions.

Specifically, the revision will establish additional regulations and guidelines for the issuance of decisions, the publication of opinions, the scheduling of hearings, and will also describe the nature of Board hearings.

The five-member Board of Equalization is a publicly elected tax board that hears business tax appeals, acts as the appellate body for franchise and personal income tax appeals, and plays a significant role in the assessment and administration of property taxes. It collects more than \$44 billion annually in taxes and fees supporting state and local government services.

The September 28 Board meeting will provide an overview and introduce the proposed new regulations at Board Headquarters at 450 N Street in Sacramento. For more information visit <http://www.boe.ca.gov/regs/timelineCAtax.htm> or see the attached interested parties letter.
