Chair Runner:

The California Teachers Association respectfully opposes the proposal before the State Board of Equalization which would mend existing rules around property tax assessment appeals. CTA believes the proposed rule changes would undermine education funding provided through county property tax revenue.

The proposed rule changes would restrict Assessors' ability to collect information and remove the tools they would need to properly administer appeals hearings. As a result, these changes would have the potential to harm revenues statewide which could impact education funding, possibly harming school districts when revenue streams have finally reached 2008-09 levels, which are far from adequate.
