Runner Backs Dickinson Audit Request

SACRAMENTO – George Runner today announced his support of Assemblyman Roger Dickinson’s request for an audit to determine the overall costs of repairing the problem-plagued Board of Equalization headquarters building versus relocating to a new facility.

“The state is currently wasting millions of taxpayer dollars on repairs, while ignoring the obvious need for a new cost-effective headquarters location,” said Runner. “I’m confident a state audit will provide the evidence we need to move forward.”

In a [letter](#) to the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, Runner noted that the state is spending millions of dollars in its ongoing efforts to solve problems with the current BOE headquarters building.

Runner’s district includes the Sacramento area, home to the BOE headquarters building and many of the employees who work there.

Dickinson’s request will be considered when JLAC meets at 2 PM in State Capitol Room 126.
